

**Notice Informing Individuals About Nondiscrimination and Accessibility  
Requirements and Nondiscrimination Statement:**

**Discrimination is Against the Law**

Foxdale Village is open to all applicants/residents, complies with applicable Federal civil rights laws and does not discriminate based on race (to include hair type, hair texture, or hair style), color, religious creed (to include all aspects of religious observances and practices, as well as belief), handicap or disability, familial status, ancestry, national origin (including Limited English Proficiency), sex (to include pregnancy status, childbirth status, breastfeeding status, sex assigned at birth, gender identity or expression, affectional or sexual orientation, and differences in sex), use of guide or support animals because of the blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the resident or because the resident is a handler or training of support or guide animals.

Foxdale Village:

1. Provides free aids and services to people with disabilities to communicate effectively with us, such as:
  - a. Qualified sign language interpreters
  - b. Written information in other formats (large print, audio, accessible electronic formats, other formats)
2. Provides free language services to people whose primary language is not English, such as:
  - a. Qualified interpreters
  - b. Information written in other languages
